A reminder that Friday 23rd January 2026 will be an INSET day.

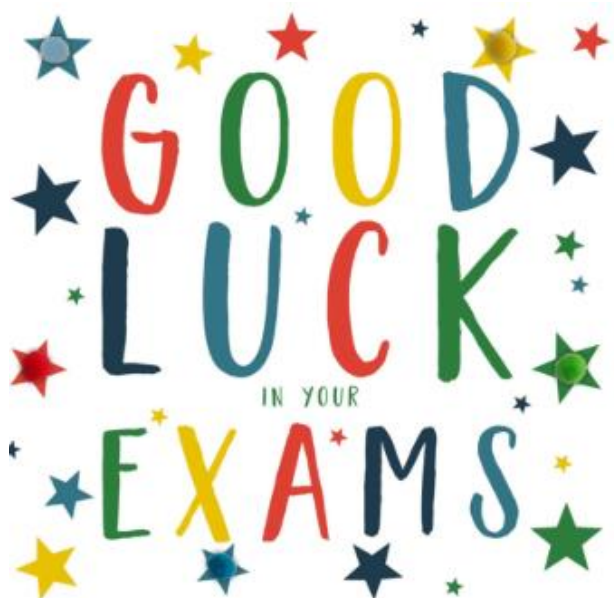
Students in Years 7, 8, 9, 10, 12 and 13 will not be required to attend school on that day.
